

Cafeteria Policy

The full cooperation of all pupils is essential in the cafeteria where large numbers of meals must be served in a short period.

The cafeteria is supervised by members of the teaching and ancillary staff who insist on high standards of behaviour at all times.

Cafeteria Code of Conduct.

- Queuing must be orderly.
- Pupils with fast meal passes are entitled to filter into the top of the queue.
- Pupils must ensure that their biometric account has sufficient funds before joining the queue for food.
- Good table manners are expected at all times.
- Each pupil is responsible for clearing his/her own area of the table after eating.
- Food remnants are to be disposed of in bins and cutlery placed in appropriate containers.
- Empty trays are to be placed in an orderly pile.
- Sixth Formers are allowed to bring food/ **cold** drinks out of the cafeteria for consumption in the common room/lunch room.

Failure to comply with any of the above will result in:

- A written report of the incident being made by the cafeteria supervisor, to the teacher on duty.
- The teacher on duty will report the incident to the pupil's Year Head.
- The incident will be dealt with in accordance with the appropriate section of the school Positive Behaviour Policy

School Meals Policy

Saint Catherine's College is dedicated to promoting healthy eating and provides students with the opportunity to make informed choices about the food they eat. The school will promote healthy eating in curriculum lessons (Home Economics, PE, Science and LLW.) and in the food served in the school canteen. Pupils are reminded to bring simple, nutritious foods as snacks and for lunch. Only water is permitted and any other types of drinks (fizzy/carbonated) are forbidden and will be confiscated. A note will also be made on a pupil's SIMs record.

Pupils are encouraged to have a healthy breakfast at home before leaving for school or to avail of the school's Breakfast Club 8.15am -8.45am each morning

- Students who bring a packed lunch to school should go to the designated lunch areas and obey the supervisor involved.
- Lunch areas are designated nut-free zones.
- In good weather, pupils who bring packed lunch to school may eat in the outside designated lunch areas and are encouraged to make use of the litter bins provided.

Only food provided by the cafeteria/packed lunches can be consumed on the school premises. The buying/selling of food/drink among the pupil body is strictly forbidden. Any breach of this rule will be dealt with in accordance with the Positive Behaviour Policy.
